What is the total amount of the bond issue?

The total amount of the April 8 bond issue is \$18,400,000.

How much will this bond issue cost me?

This is a no tax rate increase bond, meaning your current tax bill will not increase due to this bond proposal.

How will the funds be used?

- Safety & Security: Upgrades at facilities throughout the district including safe and secure entrance renovations to the Primary School & High School, upgrades to the Middle School fire alarm, and storm shutter upgrades to the Middle School.
 - Districtwide Improvements: Roof improvements/replacements, HVAC improvements, and ADA improvements throughout the district.
 - Career Tech & Activities: Greenhouse and Culinary Arts renovations to the High School, renovation and expansion of stadium seating, and construction of a new field house.
 - Addition/renovation to the Middle School to accommodate grades 6th, 7th, 8th.

SAFETY & SECURITY

For all district students and staff, it is paramount that a sense of safety and security exists in our educational environments. Upgrades to both the Primary School and High School will ensure a safe and secure entry sequence with added vestibules and protocol to buzz all visitors through the main office. Fire alarm and storm shutter upgrades at the Middle School will also ensure a safer environment in the event of an emergency or inclement weather.

DISTRICT-WIDE IMPROVEMENTS

As buildings age, many of the systems and envelope are in need of maintenance/upgrades. Roof and HVAC units at multiple campuses have reached the end of their life and are in need of replacement. By replacing both, we will ensure the longevity of buildings for the next generation to come. In addition, upgrades to ADA accessibility throughout the district will afford students with limited mobility easy access to all parts of every campus in the district.

CAREER TECH & ACTIVITIES

As career tech education continues to be a focus across many communities, this bond will fund the renovation of both the High School greenhouse and culinary arts facilities. Furthermore, upgrades to the stadium including new bleachers, press box and field house will not only allow a greater amount of seating for the community at the stadium, but will provide critical support spaces for additional activities programming (ex. women's sports).
